



CDS-POMONA CHAPTER STANDING RULES and PROCEDURES

Revised & Adopted October 22, 2019

1.0 GENERAL: These rules are subject to periodic change by vote of the Chapter's elected Board. Changes shall be published on the Chapter website, www.cdspomonachapter.org as they are made. Complete revisions of standing rules and procedures shall be prepared periodically and published for the membership. Meetings of the Chapter Board will be open to all members with the date, time and location to be published on the website. Meetings shall be held a minimum of four (4) times per calendar year to discuss Chapter business.

2.0 OFFICERS OF THE CHAPTER: The Chapter Board of Directors is comprised of the Chairperson, Vice Chair Secretary and up to four (4) additional members, a total of five (5) to seven (7) members. Elections are held annually in accordance with all CDS rules. An individual must be a member of the Pomona Chapter for a minimum of one (1) year and an active member in good standing with CDS. No Pomona Chapter Board member may be elected by the Board as the Chapter Chair unless they have been an active Pomona Chapter Board member for a minimum of one term and are also over the age of 18 years old.

In the event the Chapter Chair resigns or otherwise unable to complete their term of service, the Vice Chair assumes those duties until regularly scheduled elections.

3.0 COMMITTEES: The following committee appointments may be made by the elected Board, including but not limited to the following committees:

- Show Committee
- Junior/Young Riders
- Website
- Activities (Educational & Clinic)
- Volunteer
- Newsletter/ Email correspondence
- Sponsorship
- Contracts (Judges, Show Venue, Show Recognition, Insurance, etc.)
- Year End Awards
- Year End Banquet/Social
- Annual Elections

4.0 MEMBER OPPORTUNITIES: The following are some of the membership opportunities for Pomona Chapter members:

5.0 VOLUNTEERS AND RECOGNITION: CDS Pomona Chapter recognizes that without the hard work and dedications of its membership, family and friends, the organization would not be as successful as it is today. To show appreciation for all the effort that go into running the Chapter, the following list provides guidelines on how Chapter volunteers are recognized:

5.1 Volunteer Hours: Four hours of volunteer service are required for each horse/rider combination to be eligible for CDS Pomona Chapter Year End Awards. These hours can be obtained by donating time to staff horse shows, being an elected member of the Board, being appointed to one of the numerous committees, or by providing a \$100.00 cash donation to the Chapter. Hours can only be donated to a rider by an immediate family member or the owner of the horse that is being ridden.

6.0 SPONSORSHIPS: Dressage is one of the fastest growing equestrian sports as it allows people of all ages and abilities to participate at all levels. The Pomona Chapter membership is currently just under 90 persons. Most of our members either live or work in the local area. Each year we host a multitude of Dressage events. Sponsorships allow us to be able to fund additional educational events, available for not only our members, but also the general public whenever there is an interest.

All sponsors receive recognition at shows throughout the year. Advertisements are included on the Pomona Chapter website www.cdspomonachapter.org. Suggested amounts are listed below. Any amount is gratefully received.

Current Sponsorship Fees (subject to change)

- Platinum Sponsorship - \$500.00
- Gold Sponsorship - \$250.00
- Silver Sponsorship - \$100.00
- Bronze Sponsorship – amounts less than \$100.00

7.0 POMONA CHAPTER SHOWS: Annually, the Chapter offers four (4) CDS rated shows that shall follow CDS Standing Rules Section 1.0-CDS Competitions as to how they are recognized, conducted, organized, and scheduled. These shows may also be WDAA and/or CAWDA rated.

7.1 For all Chapter shows, the Chapter may hire an outside Manager and/or Secretary, at a fee negotiated and approved by the elected Board, but the overall organization and running of the shows, including facility rental, stabling, volunteers and other day-to-day business, will remain the responsibility of the Pomona Chapter and its show committee and/or Chapter Board.

8.0 POMONA CHAPTER YEAR END AWARDS: The show season for the year-end awards program runs as concurrently as possible with the CDS/USDF show season.

8.1 To be eligible for ANY Pomona Chapter Year-End Awards, including but not limited to Championship and Reserve Awards, Dressage Seat Equitation Awards, Season High Score Awards, Perpetual Trophy Awards, and Sponsored Year End Awards the rider must comply with the following:

8.2 Be a Pomona Chapter active member in good standing at the time the scores are earned OR pay a nominating fee of \$35 to the Pomona Chapter. The nominating fee allows non Pomona Chapter members to be eligible for year end awards. The fee must be paid on or before August 15th of the competition year.

8.3 Four hours of volunteer service are required for each horse/rider combination ie) a rider showing 3 horses must have a total of 12 volunteer hours to be eligible for CDS Pomona Chapter Year End Awards. These hours can be obtained by donating time to volunteer/staff horse shows, being an elected member of the Board, being appointed to one of the numerous committees, or by providing \$100.00 cash donation (equivalent to four (4) hours of service) to the Chapter on or before August 31st of the competition year. Hours can only be donated to a rider by an immediate family member or the owner of the horse that is being ridden.

8.4 Maintain “good-standing” status as a Pomona chapter member. In agreement with the USDF and USEF disciplinary actions, the Pomona chapter members must uphold exemplary conduct – acting in a manner deemed improper, unethical, dishonest, unsportsmanlike, intemperate or prejudicial to the best interest of the sport and the Chapter will not be tolerated. Members not upholding these standards will be held accountable according to the disciplinary process in place under the CDS/USDF/USEF disciplinary rules. Members with questionable standing will be allowed a hearing in front of the current elected Board of the chapter. If at the conclusion of the hearing, a 2/3 vote of the elected board is reached to enforce disciplinary action, the possibilities for discipline include but will not be limited to the following: inability to earn points for the Pomona Chapter Year End Award Program, inability to hold any volunteer position within the chapter, inability to receive subsidized Pomona Chapter rates for Chapter sponsored clinics or events. This chapter member’s overall CDS membership will not be at risk unless determined otherwise by the CDS Executive Board.

9.0 POMONA CHAPTER CHAMPIONSHIP AND RESERVE QUALIFICATIONS (All Levels):

9.1 Awards are available as Open, Adult Amateur and Junior/Young Rider

9.2 In accordance with USDF/USEF rules, Adult Amateurs must have a copy of their USEF membership card showing Amateur status on file with show management at the time the scores as Adult Amateur are earned.

9.3 For Introductory through Fourth Level, the horse/rider combination must compete at a MINIMUM of two Chapter recognized shows and obtain a MINIMUM of three scores at the same level/division. For Prix St. Georges through Grand Prix, the horse/rider combination must compete in a MINIMUM of two Chapter recognized shows and obtain a MINIMUM of two scores at the same level/division.

9.4 The scores will be averaged and the highest percentage will be Champion, the second highest percentage will be Reserve Champion in each division, as described above. See 9.5 below for rules on how scores are averaged.

9.5 For Introductory through Fourth Level, if more than three scores are earned, the top three HIGHEST scores from a MINIMUM of two Pomona Chapter recognized shows will be averaged. For Prix St. Georges through Grand Prix, if more than two scores are earned, the top two HIGHEST scores from a MINIMUM of two Pomona Chapter recognized shows will be averaged.

9.6 Horse/Rider combinations are only eligible for awards in consecutive levels (i.e. Training and First, but not Training and Second).

9.7 The Champion horse/rider combination at any given level may NOT be won in two (2) consecutive years.

9.8 The Reserve Champion horse/rider combination at any given level is eligible to compete for Championship at the same level in consecutive years.

10.0 DRESSAGE SEAT EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIP & RESERVE QUALIFICATIONS:

10.1 Awards are available as Adult Amateur and Junior/Young Rider and based on RIDER ONLY.

10.2 In accordance with USDF/USEF rules, Adult Amateurs must have a copy their USEF membership card showing Amateur status on file with show management at the time the scores as Adult Amateur are earned.

10.3 The rider must compete at a MINIMUM of two Chapter recognized shows and obtain a MINIMUM of two scores in the Dressage Seat Equitation classes offered at any Pomona Chapter recognized show.

10.4 The scores will be averaged and the highest percentage will be Champion and the second highest percentage will be Reserve Champion.

- 10.5 If more than two scores are earned, the top two HIGHEST scores will be averaged.
- 10.6 The Champion in dressage seat equitation may NOT be won in two (2) consecutive years.

11.0 SEASON HIGH SCORE AWARDS:

- 11.1 Awards are available to Open, Adult Amateur or Junior/Young Rider.
- 11.2 In accordance with USDF/USEF rules, Adult Amateurs must have a copy of their USEF membership card showing Amateur status on file with show management at the time the scores as Adult Amateur are earned.
- 11.3 There is no minimum show requirement; the season high score at each level from the entire show season shall be used to calculate award standing.
- 11.4 Prior year Pomona Chapter Champion and Reserve Champion at a given level may win a Season High Score Award at the same level in successive years.
- 11.5 Horse/rider combinations are only eligible for awards in consecutive levels (i.e. Training and First, but not Training and Second)

12.0 CHAPTER PERPETUAL TROPHIES: Perpetual trophies are awarded to Pomona Chapter horse/rider combinations competing at Introductory Level and above at Pomona Chapter recognized shows. The recipients will retain the trophy for one year, at which time it will need to be returned in the same condition it was received in to the Banquet Committee. The recipient is responsible for the maintenance of the trophy in its given state. A member may receive more than one trophy in a season. Any trophy must be returned to the Chapter Board by no later than August 15th of the following competition year.

**Non-Pomona Chapter members who have paid the nominating fee must also have fulfilled the volunteer hour requirement or paid the volunteer hour waiver fee per horse/rider combination.*

Charlotte Langlois Perpetual Trophy:

- Awarded to the Pomona Chapter member, or non member who has paid the nominating fee, with the OVERALL HIGHEST SCORE received at any Pomona Chapter recognized show, at FIRST LEVEL (Traditional, regardless of division).

Datsa Toyota Perpetual Trophy:

- Awarded to the Pomona Chapter member, or non member who has paid the nominating fee, with the OVERALL HIGHEST SCORE received at any Pomona Chapter recognized show, at TRAINING LEVEL OR ABOVE (Traditional, regardless of division).

Sherry Guess Junior/Young Rider Perpetual Trophy

- Awarded to the Pomona Chapter Junior/Young Rider member, or non member who has paid the nominating fee, with the OVERALL HIGHEST JUNIOR/YOUNG RIDER SCORE received at any Pomona Chapter recognized show, at TRAINING LEVEL OR ABOVE (Traditional)

Pomona Chapter Adult Amateur Award

- Awarded to the Pomona Chapter Adult Amateur member (with USEF membership card showing Amateur status), or non member who has paid the nominating fee, with the OVERALL HIGHEST ADULT AMATEUR SCORE received at any Pomona Chapter recognized show, at TRAINING LEVEL OR ABOVE (Traditional).

Rocking T Ranch Perpetual Trophies

- Awarded to the Pomona Chapter Adult Amateur AND Junior/Young Rider member, or non member who has paid the nominating fee, with the OVERALL HIGHEST SCORE received at any Pomona Chapter recognized show, at INTRODUCTORY LEVEL (Traditional).

Azure Farms Perpetual Trophy

- Awarded to the Pomona Chapter Member, or non member who has paid the nominating fee, with the OVERALL HIGHEST SCORE received at any Pomona Chapter recognized show, at SECOND LEVEL (regardless of division).

Pomona Chapter Volunteer of the Year

- Awarded to any individual, whether Chapter member or not that has given voluntary time and effort to the betterment of Chapter events throughout the year. This award is given to an individual who has provided voluntary service above and beyond without any expectation of reward.

Susan Hoffman Peacock Pony Awards

- Awarded to the Pomona Chapter Adult Amateur AND Junior/Young Rider member, or non member who has paid the nominating fee, with the OVERALL HIGHEST SCORE received at any Pomona Chapter recognized show at TRAINING LEVEL OR ABOVE (Traditional) riding a mount with a USEF PONY CERTIFICATION CARD.

Luna Tunes Freestyle Award

- Awarded to the Pomona Chapter Member, or non member who has paid the nominating fee, with the OVERALL HIGHEST SCORE received at any Pomona Chapter recognized show, in any MUSICAL FREESTYLE CLASS (Traditional or Western, regardless of division)

Lisa Scebbi Western Dressage Award

- Awarded to a Pomona Chapter Member, or non member who has paid the nominating fee, with the OVERALL HIGHEST SCORE received at any Pomona Chapter recognized show, in any WESTERN DRESSAGE Class (regardless of division).

13.0 SPONSORED YEAR END AWARDS:

TK Year-End Equitation Awards

- Awarded to the Pomona Chapter Adult Amateur AND Junior/Young Rider member, or non member who has paid the nominating fee, with the OVERALL HIGHEST SCORE received at any Pomona Chapter recognized show, in a DRESSAGE SEAT EQUITATION (Traditional) class. The Champion recipient may NOT win in successive years and will NO longer be eligible for this award once received.

Jan Churella Memorial Award

- Awarded to the Pomona Chapter Adult Amateur member, age 50 and older, (with USEF membership card showing Amateur status) with the OVERALL HIGHEST ADULT AMATEUR SCORE received at any Pomona Chapter recognized show, at FIRST LEVEL (Traditional). The winning horse/rider combination may NOT be won in two (2) consecutive years.

14.0 RIDER SUBSIDY AWARD: Each quarter the Pomona Chapter will provide a Rider Subsidy to a member in good standing who applies for the subsidy. This subsidy is to provide up to \$300.00 in reimbursement for educational costs for any member - Amateur, Junior/Young Rider, or Open. One (1) subsidy awards shall be given per quarter. Applicants must submit their application in complete in accordance with the rules posted on the application form that can be found on the website www.cdspomonachapter.org

15.0 EXPENSES: If funding is available, annually the Pomona Chapter pays for or reimburses or donates to/for the following:

- Hotel and travel reimbursement for the Chapter Chair or Chapter Representative(s) at the CDS Annual Meeting.
- Expense of the Chapter basket provided to the CDS Annual Meeting.
- One (1) participant/rider in the CDS Southern Linda O'Carroll Memorial Adult Amateur Clinic.
- One (1) participant/rider in the CDS Junior Clinic
- Expenses associated with the hiring of a show manager or secretary for the Pomona Chapter show(s).
- Subsidizes the cost of the Year-End banquet (difference in monies between charges and expense to members attending).

15.1 CDS Annual Meeting and Allocation of Chapter Funds for the event: The Chapter will provide reimbursement for the incoming or returning Chapter Chair and one additional Board member to attend the CDS Annual meeting when not held locally in the form of one shared hotel room, banquet cost, rental car if necessary and reasonable airfare with CDS reimbursing a maximum of \$150.00 in travel expenses. Any cost for attending the offered symposium will be at the members personal cost. When the Annual Meeting is local, the Chapter shall pay for any Board member that chooses to attend the banquet.

16.0 DONATIONS: If funding is available, annually the Pomona Chapter makes a donation to the following organizations in an amount voted upon annually by the elected Board.

- CDS Club 100 Grant Fund (\$100.00 annually)
- Carol Plough Youth Scholarship Fund (\$100.00 annually)
- Sharon Carpenter Scholarship Fund (\$100.00 annually)
- Southern Junior Championship (\$100.00 annually or cost of class sponsorship)
- CDS Championship Show
- CDS Southern RAAC
- CDS Junior Clinic/CDS Linda O'Carroll Memorial Adult Amateur Clinic (alternating years)
